Good Friday's Here, But Easter is Coming

This year Easter falls on April 16th. Half of the month of April is spent in the season of Lent; the second half of the month is in the Easter season. This is an apt metaphor for our lives as Christians. As followers of Jesus Christ we live in the Kingdom of God that is realized, yet not fully realized. In the person of Jesus Christ we have witnessed the reality of Easter life and yet it has not been fully realized by us. St. Paul assures us that Jesus' resurrection is the first fruits of our own resurrection.

We still live, however, in the reality of this present world where there is disease, war, strife, discord and evil. We live in the midst of Good Friday even though we believe that Easter is coming. That isn't an easy place to live. While others proclaim "the sky is falling, the sky is falling," we place our hope in the incomparable ability of God to save.

Some years ago I ran across a description of this way of living in the works of the

German theologian Wolfhart Pannenberg. He described God's kingdom as being *proleptic*. *Prolepsis is an anticipatory; assumption that a future event has already happened.* For Pannenberg, the Kingdom of God that we hope for (a future event), is *proleptically present* (already happened) in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Now we, as the Church who are in Christ, are to live as *proleptic people*. We live our lives as if the fullness of God's kingdom is already present.

In case I've lost you, let me describe three different ways that we live *proleptically*, living as Easter people even in the midst of Lent. First, is in our baptism. In many ancient churches people were baptized in a six-sided baptismal font. It represented the sixth day of creation which is Friday, more specifically, Good Friday. We are baptized into the death of Jesus. "They then came out of the baptismal font standing within a baptistery that was octagonal in shape." This octagon symbolized the eighth

day of creation which was a symbol for a "new" creation.

Second, every time a church celebrates the Holy Eucharist we not only look back in remembrance, but we also look forward in anticipation. The spiritual food we receive is anticipatory of the Messianic Banquet that we will one day share with Christ when he comes again. Third, our funeral liturgy is an Easter liturgy. When we conduct a funeral, even in the midst of Lent, the altar hangings are white, the color of Easter. Our liturgy proclaims that "even at the grave we make our song: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia."

What we do liturgically is intended to shape our imagination. So as we conclude these last two weeks of Lent and enter into Holy Week, don't forget that Easter is right around the corner. Don't forget that even in the midst of suffering and death that we are reminded of on Good Friday we are a Church who lives in hope, living even now as Easter people.

Mission of the Month



East Texas Child Advocates, Inc. is a nonprofit organization devoted to helping abused and neglected children in five East Texas counties. We make a difference in the lives of children through two programs: East Texas CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) and Getting Together Safely. East Texas CASA recruits and trains volunteers to advocate for the best interest of abused and neglected children who have been removed from their homes and placed in foster care. Volunteers work with the judge to ensure a forever home for each child. CASA is the only volunteer organization that empowers everyday citizens as officers of the court. In an overburdened social welfare system, abused and neglected children often slip through the cracks among hundreds of current cases. CASA volunteers change that. Appointed by judges, CASA volunteers typically handle just one case at a time and commit to staying on that case until the child is placed in a safe, permanent home. While others may come and go, CASA volunteers provide that one constant that children need in order to thrive. Funding for these agencies comes from local gifts and individual contributions, along with federal, state and county grants. East Texas Child Advocates is a Greater Longview United Way participating agency.

March Vestry Report

March’s vestry meeting opened with the vestry members articulating prayer requests that were on their hearts. After the opening prayers the meeting was called to order by Fr. Kevin with a quorum being present. The agenda for the meeting was approved as presented. With one small change to the February Vestry minutes they were approved unanimously.

The February financials were then presented by our treasurer Andrew Snell. The only material change on the balance sheet was a significant decrease in the cash position. This was due to a larger than expected payment of accounts payable and a deficit in pledge giving for the month of February. Pledge income was \$7,769.93 below budget which contributed to an overall loss in February of \$11,600.93. Expenses for the month were \$4,501.94 below budget. Fr. Kevin expressed concern to the Vestry that this lack of pledge income is unsustainable for

the future. It was pointed out by Fr. Kevin that the average pledge per pledge unit is very healthy. What is of concern is that only a little over half of our families pledge or contribute to the church finances.

Our Sr. Warden Cherry Sikes reported on a number of items. Of special interest was a vestry workshop conducted by the diocese that Brenda Alexander, Kathy Gray and Cherry attended. Cherry reported that she was pleased to discover that Trinity was doing many of the things that were presented as marks of a healthy congregation. Cherry reported that work continues to be done on the Igniting Faith program with Molly Carnes. As Senior Warden she has been in communication with the facilitators of the specific areas of concentration for our strategic plan.

Cherry reported that Bill Charles as facilitator of the Mission Team of Igniting Faith and she met with the director of the Episcopal Health Foundation. This foundation was the result of the diocese’s sale of the St. Luke Hospital System in Houston. The foundation is looking for ways to partner

with local Episcopal churches to bring various types of wellness programs to their communities. In Longview the foundation has made grants to Specialty Health Services, Sabine Valley, and D.O.R.S..

A recap was given about the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper that was hosted by the Vestry and held at the Trinity School of Texas Commons. It was a great success with over 225 people being served. The live jazz band was a wonderful addition and many positive comments were received from the school staff and parents about the event. The last item Cherry presented was the latest version of the A.P.O.S.T.L.E.S. organizational chart of the ministries at Trinity. Conversation then ensued about the vacancies on the chart and the need to delegate to lay persons a number of ministries that are now being done by church staff.

The last item of business was the approval of Fr. Kevin’s housing allowance resolution for IRS purposes. The vestry meeting then concluded with the office of Compline.
