WHAT I'VE LEARNED ABOUT "THE GOOD OLE DAYS"

There is a natural flow of change that begins with the departure of the current Rector and ends with the arrival and onboarding of the new Rector. "Onboarding" is a term used by human resources folks to mean "orientation" – another HR term for meeting and greeting the "newly hired" and assisting them in becoming familiar with the duties and new surroundings of his or her new position.

Recalling my first opportunity to be a manager, I learned quickly, that the "new guy" just hired, upon arrival, may be a big relief — new ideas, new energy, new talents, new personality, maybe even a new hairstyle — all those attributes that the former incumbent did not have or was perceived to lack! Then, reality sets in and we begin to learn more about this individual we have so carefully selected. Is this person the right choice? Herein lies the danger of second guessing decisions made in the change!

No person living today is perfect – we learned that in Sunday Church School! And here at Trinity, as we move through the phases of transition that our Diocese has so carefully laid out before us, we must do our best to avoid the pitfalls:

- Being unrealistic about our present situation and needs
- Creating a parish profile based upon "we wish we were where we were" or believe we were ten or fifteen or even twenty years ago
- Selecting a new Rector, who more than anything, is as different from the past Rector as possible, placing undue emphasis on skills or personality traits not offered by the former Rector
- Expecting the new Rector to be the solution for all our congregational problems without recognizing that needed changes will come without being open to those whatever they are!

The message here is that "the good ole days", whether perceived as good or not so good, are gone and as an early mentor of mine used as a toast, "don't look back"! Do your part to participate when asked. Be honest, be open, be hopeful, be supportive, be patient. And, please continue to pray!

TRINITY VETERANS OUTREACH MEETINGS

JUNE 2017

The June meeting was very special. We had a great turn out for our cleaning of the Vietnam Wall in Teague Park, in preparation for the July 4th celebration. KLTV Channel 7 news came and interviewed several of our veterans and spouses to explain just why they would take time to clean the Vietnam Wall. One explanation was not to honor the Vietnam War but to honor the warriors names on the wall, all 58,307 of them who did not get to come home. We must not let their memories fade; they deserve to live on in eternity. Another reason was there are high school classmates and a relative on the wall. It is such an honor to remember them all. Patti and Dee Shappel made a sizeable donation to the Veterans Recognition Program (these folks are the reason these memorials even exist in Longview) to help finance and promote the park. If you have not visited Teague Park recently, we encourage doing so as soon as possible.

JULY 2017

Trinity Veterans Outreach programs are really interesting. The July meeting was open to the public as well as veterans. We had another good turn out to enjoy the company and stories of two WWII pilots, Colonel Gid Terry and Lieutenant Bill English, both veterans, now in their nineties, both living in Longview. Bill English shared how he flew fifteen P51 Mustang fighter plane missions in fifteen months, between Iwo Jima and Japan, his mission was escorting (defending) B17 bombers. His last mission was the day before Hiroshima was bombed. He related how much flight technology advanced so that planes of the near future were beyond imagination. That's when Gid Terry shared the history of the SR-71 Blackbird, the plane that replaced the U2 spy plane. It could fly three times the speed of sound (Mach 3), had to be refueled every 60 minutes by aerial tankers and flew at 85,000 feet (about 16 miles high). The skin temperature outside the cockpit was 600 degrees Fahrenheit while the skin above the engines was 1,600 degrees Fahrenheit. Reconnaissance was the only mission of this aircraft as it had zero weapons on board; it photographed landscapes for intelligence. This aircraft was replaced by satellites. We truly had two national treasures sitting among us, telling stories that made it all come alive. We were blessed again and again.

Remember - Freedom is not free and never has been.

The July Vestry meeting included reports and discussion regarding the following:

- \$20,000 draw from Endowment Fund; cash position remains virtually unchanged. Harry Barth joined the Finance Committee;
- Myra Smith has been recommended for membership on the Endowment Board to replace Stan Hayes.
- Vote to enhance the collection counting and to provide chain of custody. The collection will be
 placed in locked deposit bags before being placed in the Sacristy vault safe and counting will
 include a member of the Vestry to assist the Parish Administrator or in his absence, the Music
 Ministries Director or the Interim Rector.
- The 2017 Stewardship Drive will focus on developing Stewards. "God's Bountiful Grace, Growing Stewards" will be the theme of the drive that will kick off October 1.
- Other items discussed: supply clergy, Orthodox Christians meeting once monthly in Coffee Café
 (approved), the Fall In Ministry and Education Fair and the CAT (Congregational
 Assessment) survey distribution.
- Meg Freeman has been appointed to the TST Board of Trustees
- The Senior Warden is working with parish staff to cut unnecessary expenditures in office supplies namely, paper and reproduction expense by redesigning the Sunday bulletins, elimination of duplicate name tags, etc.

CONFIRMATION AND DISCOVERY CLASSES FOR ADULTS

The Episcopal Church is a fascinating "organism!" No matter how long you have attended the Episcopal Church, there is always something more to learn about our history, worship, intelligence and mission. Becoming an Episcopalian is an awesome experience and a commitment!

While Baptism is the chief rite of initiation into Christian faith and the church, and since the Episcopal Church is now administering Communion to all baptized persons, the stringent requirement for Confirmation is not what it once was. But who would want to miss the indescribable feeling of the laying on of hands by the Bishop or being introduced to the beauty of the liturgy and history of our church?

An Adult Confirmation class – including lectures, an introduction to the Book of Common Prayers, docent tours of the sanctuary, the history of the Church international and more is being organized. Our plan is for these six classes to be led by "team teachers" who we are currently "recruiting".
