

Having put the naming task behind us, we were able to hold two special ceremonies, on Patriot's Day, 9/11/2016, fifteenth anniversary of the terrorist attacks on America; NYC twin towers, the Pentagon and a field in Pennsylvania. Prayers of thanksgiving for those souls lost in the tragedies of that day and peace for those left behind were lifted up. Also we set up a POW/MIA/KIA table for those missing veterans still unable to return home to their families. Special prayers were offered for their protection, safety and quick return home and to remember them continually until we see them again. It was also an exciting evening as Fr. 

September Vestry Meeting

After opening prayer, the first item for consideration at the



Under the Rector's Report Fr.

Kevin reminded the Vestry of their obligation along with the staff's to attend the Safeguarding God's People training on October 8th. Bishop Fisher will be visiting on October 9th and will meet with the Vestry after the service. In preparation for that visitation, we reported on how Safeguarding God's People training is proceeding as required. Fr. Kevin also asked that the Vestry begin to think about creating a Finance/Budget committee that would take on more responsibility of creating the annual budget and relieve him of that task. He also distributed a copy of a volunteer organizational chart of the different ministries that are present at Trinity. The Vestry was asked to consider what parishioners might fill some of the vacancies and also relieve staff members of responsibilities that are beyond their job descriptions

The last item Fr. Kevin shared with the Vestry was his reflections on a meeting with the Chief Executive Officer of the Episcopal Health

Foundation at Christ Church in Tyler. With the creation of the Episcopal Health Foundation there are monies available to communities in our diocese of health research, conveying of task forces to address health issues in our communities and grants to nonprofit agencies engaged in providing better health care. Kim Howard offered that there might be some collaborative effort that the hospitals of Longview and the EHF might be able to undertake. Fr. Kevin suggested that with the parish's history with Good Shepherd Medical Center and the large number of physicians and other health care workers we have in the parish it might be time to create a Health Care Task Force at the parish explore possibilities for our Longview community.

The last piece of business addressed was a report by John Hall on repairs to the Trinity Conference Center house that had been authorized by the Endowment Board.
