

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of

salvation!" (2Corinthians 5:20, 6:2)

Billy Graham used to do a radio program entitled the "Hour of Decision." For Christians, that time is always **NOW.** Throughout the season of Lent, God renews our prayer life and practices of discipleship, including the "works of mercy." In Jesus Christ, we are called to practice radical forgiveness, justice, mercy, and love with every last human being.

In Holy Baptism, we are called to the apostolic work of sharing the Good News of what God has done, once and for all, in Jesus. We are to let people know how God loves them and to show them God's new and better way to live. The life that Jesus lived, the death that he died, and the blood he shed for us sinners compels us to turn back to God—and back to each other. As Dorothy Day once observed, "I only love God as much as the person I love the least."

Ash Wednesday services are on Wednesday, March 5 at 12:15 PM and 6:00 PM. We will observe the Sundays in Lent with worship focused on repentance and renewal in God's ways of mercy and love. In the Name of the Church, I invite you to a holy Lent. For, in the words of the Prayer Book, "the whole congregation" is thereby "put in mind of the message of pardon and absolution set forth in the Gospel of our Savior, and of the need which all Christians continually have to renew their repentance and faith." (BCP, p. 265)

Founded in 1988, Windridge Therapeutic Center is making great strides in the lives of children and adults by providing therapeutic horsemanship programs, physical therapies, academics, and life skills. Windridge's therapeutic horsemanship programs are funded by individuals, corporations, churches, and civic organizations. Donations received in support of these programs are investments in lives of children and adults with disabilities. Windridge is home to more than 140 participants and 70+ volunteers a week, 9 full time staff members, and 24 horses.

First Quarter Trinity Veteran's Meeting on February 2, 2025 Dinah Rushing

The meeting was called to order by Gayland Rushing. The opening prayer was led by Stan Wiley, and the pledge of allegiance was recited by all seven attendees (Gayland, Stan, David, Lynn, George, Todd, and Dinah). We were blessed to have a new member, Todd Schumann, Coast Guard, join our group. Our focus for this meeting was the Memorial Sunday, May 25, 2025 agenda. Stan will be the flag bearer and speaker for the 0800 service and Gayland will do the same honors at the 1030 service. We plan to be at Teague Park on Memorial Day, Monday, May 26, 2025 around 0900-1200, to visit, encourage, and pray with fellow veterans and their families, and to provide help finding names on the Vietnam Wall via the computer app, virtualwall.org. We will also pass out a book, Psalm 91, God's Shield of Protection, by Peggy Joyce Ruth to any interested veteran, and bottled water as needed. May God continue to bless America and the past, current, and future veterans of the United States armed forces. Remember, freedom has never been free!

I have been a musician since I was six years old, and "practice makes perfect" is truth. When I was rehearsing a classical piece for a concert, my teacher would give me so many exercises to do – scales, finger exercises, etc. Only after I completed those would I begin to practice the actual piece I was going to perform. I would start by learning one section at a time. If there was a particular part I was struggling with, she would have me practice it very slowly then pick up the tempo as I got comfortable. But, as time approached for the performance, she would have me play these sections faster than they needed to be as it made the performance pace feel more natural. After weeks of building intensity, I was finally ready for the concert.

As we approach the beginning of Lent, I invite you to think about our practice of Christianity in the same way. Through the seasons in our Liturgical Calendar, we experience deeper worship and study at certain times of the year and less at others. This creates a beautiful rhythm for our lives.

Lent is one of those seasons where we are called to shift our attention and commit to different practices as we prepare for Holy Week and Easter. It is a time to practice, doing "exercises" to deepen our relationship with God, diving deep into something different, which will help us notice new feelings about what God needs from us.

Just as I received clarity of my ability when practicing a new piece of music, I wish for you an intensity during Lent that will make Holy Week and Easter fresh for you.
