A Letter from Our Diocesan Bishop, Andy Doyle

Dear Dr. Prior, Mtr. Shelby, and beloved in Christ at Trinity Episcopal Church, Longview,

I write to you with hope. In a time when our world and the City of Longview ache for signs of light and steadiness, Trinity's witness matters. Longview needs a strong Trinity Church. Now is the time to take the next faithful step together.

In recent seasons, disagreements within the parish have weighed heavily on a few hearts, particularly around the tenure and leadership of your previous rector. We acknowledge the pain, disappointment, and anxiety some have felt. At the same time, we give thanks for the health and vitality that emerged in that season. There are, in fact, signs of growth, renewed ministry, and a broad-hearted welcome that has sought to be a church for people without a church and a community that welcomes diverse ideas. I appreciate the leadership of the vestry over these past years and of the rector.

In Christ, we are one body (Ephesians 4:1–6). That unity is not uniformity; it is a covenant of love. Today I ask you to lay down resentments and set aside old divisions for the sake of the future God is calling you to share. Not the certainty that demands agreement on every point, but the clarity that comes from Jesus at the center—clarity about who you are, whom you serve, and how you will walk together.

The Diocese stands with you. We are here to strengthen your leaders, to resource your ministries, and to accompany you with prayer, counsel, and practical support. Your current leadership has carried much and, like all of us, at times feels fragile. Please uphold them. Speak to them with charity. Pray for them by name. Encourage them in good works.

We ask each member of Trinity to commit to these simple practices in the months ahead:

- Pray daily for Trinity's unity and mission, that Christ's peace may rule in your hearts (Colossians 3:15).
- Speak truth in love (Ephesians 4:15): address concerns directly and with humility, avoiding gossip and contempt.
- Choose reconciliation over winning. When wrongs are named, seek forgiveness and offer it freely.
- Serve together: show up, shoulder a ministry, and share the work of hospitality and healing.

Beloved, now is a moment for courage. God is calling Trinity beyond disappointment, fear, anxiety, and anger into a renewed community rooted in prayer, eager for reconciliation, and alive to the Holy Spirit's future. The hope before you is not thin optimism; it is the risen Christ who has already gone ahead of you into Longview, preparing good works for you to walk in. Let us resolve, therefore, to guard our unity, invest in our shared mission, and take the next step in faith. We are confident that, by God's grace, Trinity will be a place where strangers are welcomed, the weary find rest, and the Gospel is proclaimed with clarity and joy. Know that we are praying for you and are ready to help—today and in the days to come.

Epiphany, also called **Feast of the Epiphany**, **Theophany**, or **Three Kings' Day**, (from Greek *epiphaneia*, "manifestation"), is a Christian holiday commemorating the first manifestation of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles, represented by the Magi, and the manifestation of his divinity, as it occurred at his baptism in the Jordan River and at his first miracle, at Cana in Galilee. Epiphany is one of the three principal and oldest festival days of the Christian church (the other two are Easter and Christmas). Roman Catholics, Lutherans, Anglicans, and other Western churches observe the feast on January 6, while some Eastern Orthodox churches celebrate Epiphany on January 19, since their Christmas Eve falls on January 6.

The festival originated in the Eastern church, where it at first included a commemoration of Christ's birth. In Rome, by 354 Christ's birth was being celebrated on December 25, and later in the 4th century the church in Rome began celebrating Epiphany on January 6. In the Western church the festival primarily commemorates the visit by the Magi to the infant Jesus, which is seen as evidence that Christ, the Jewish Messiah, came also for the salvation of Gentiles. In the East it primarily commemorates the baptism of Jesus and celebrates the revelation that the incarnate Christ was both fully God and fully man.

We observe traditions unique to the Feast of Epiphany, including the Bonfire, where we burn the Christmas trees used to celebrate the birth of Christ. The fire represents the light that Christ brings into the world.
